


# PLUG & PLAY FINANCES FLOW CHART

## How can you tell if your camp is a Plug & Play? Easy - use this chart!


Plug & Play camps? Hell no - it's one of the issues that makes our hair stand on end and raises hackles. Here's an easy way to determine if your camp could be considered a Plug and Play camp. We've separated it into two issues: financial gain and (non) participation, because making money of other people's gift are unacceptable, and participation is the only way this social experiment works. # PLUG & PLAY PARTICIPATION FLOW CHART

If it talks luxury, comes with a hefty price and requires you to do nothing, chances are it's Plug & Play.

Here's the thing: participation is key to doing the thing in the desert. If you can pay a fee to rock up and have your experience catered, and there's no expectation that you'll pull your weight and get involved in anything other than your own pleasure, your camp is missing the point. Entitlement, at the burn? It doesn't fit.



Are you entitled to anything at the burn?

YES!

Go home. Stay there.

Are you participating in the upkeep of your camp? (pitching tents, MOOPing, cleaning, cooking and taking your trash home)

YES!

Is your camp serviced during the burn?

YES!

Did anyone organise your travel and supplies for you?

YES!

NO!

Is the bulk of the infrastructure for your camp installed and removed without anyone from the camp being present and involved?

YES!

NO!

Is anyone paid in cash or tickets or food etc to work in your camp during the burn?

YES!

NO!

Yikes! Looks like it's Plug & Play
